WHEREAS, the City of Payette, has sought to develop policies and memorialize them in writing so that they may serve as guidelines for the operation of the City and its employees and provide for successful and efficient function of the City of Payette; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council previously approved the Idaho Policing Policy Manual and subsequent supplement on August 20, 2020; and

WHEREAS, due to recent changes with minor edits to improve clarity, it is necessary to update the Idaho Policing Policy Manual (See Attached Update Changes), and


WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Mayor and City Council to adopt and approve the Idaho Policing Policy Manual dated 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Payette, that the Idaho Policing Policy Manual is hereby approved and adopted for the City of Payette, Idaho, effective September 6, 2022.
