ORDINANCE NO. 496

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ELECTION OFFICERS: FIXING THEIR TERM OF OFFICE; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF APPOINTMENT TO BE GIVEN BY THE CITY CLERK AND FOR ACCEPTANCE; PROVIDING METHOD OF FILLING VACANCIES; REQUIRING THE CITY COUNCIL TO FIX POLLING PLACES AND FURNISH ELECTION SUPPLIES AND FIXING THE COMPENSATION OF ELECTION OFFICERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE:

Section 1. Council to appoint Election Officers.- The City Council shall at its regular meeting in March, prior to each biennial election, appoint four capable and discreet persons, possessing the qualifications of electors, in each ward as election officers. Two of such persons shall be designated as Judges of Election and two of such persons as Clerks of Election.

Section 2 . Term of Office.- Such officials shall hold office for the period of ~~two~~ years and shall be the officials of all elections, both general and special , during that period.

Section 3. Clerk to Give Notice of Appointment.- The City Clerk shall give such appointees notice of their appointment and shall request each appointee to give notice of his acceptance or declination of his appointment to the City Clerk within ten days thereafter.

Section 4. Vacancies-- How Filled.- Any vacancies arising in the office of election officials shall be filled by the City Council at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose. If such vacancy does not become apparent until the time of the opening of the polls, the qualified electors present may fill such vacancies from any electors present.

Section 5. Council to Designate Polling Places and Furnish Supplies.- The City Council shall designate suitable polling places in each ward and cause the same to be provided with suitable voting compartments, supplies, official stamps, ballot boxes and such other supplies as County Commissioners are required to provide for state elections.

Section 6. Compensation of Judges and Clerks of Election.- The Compensation of Judges and Clerks of Election shall be four dollars per day which shall cover the period from the opening of the polls until the work is completed.
