

ORDINANCE NO. 631

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9-702, REVISED CODE OF PAYETTE, 1946, RELATING TO THE ADOPTION OF THE "PLUMBING CODE OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF MASTER PLUMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES INCORPORATED" TO PROVIDE THAT ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE RELATING TO PLUMBING AND SEWERS ARE IN ADDITION TO THE PLUMBING CODE OF THE STATE OF IDAHO; ADDING A NEW SECTION TO THE REVISED CODE OF PAYETTE, 1946, DESIGNATED AS SECTION 9-802 (a), RELATING TO OPENING, BREAKING AND CONNECTION TO SEWER LINES OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE; ADDING A NEW SECTION TO THE REVISED CODE OF PAYETTE, 1946, DESIGNATED AS SECTION 9-814 (a), RELATING TO SAND AND GREASE INTERCEPTORS IN CERTAIN ESTABLISHMENTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO:

Section 1. That Section 9-702, Revised Code of Payette, 1946, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"9-702. Ordinances Supplement State Code. Ordinances of the City of Payette relating to plumbing and sewers are in addition to minimum standards or requirements as provided by Chapter 27, Title 39, Idaho Code, as the same may be amended from time to time."

Section 2. That the Revised Code of Payette, 1946, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Section 9-802 (a), which reads as follows:

"9-802 (a). Opening, Breaking and Connection to Sewer Lines. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to open or break any sewer line of the City of Payette except in the presence and with the approval of the City Administrator or other City official designated by him. The City Administrator may adopt such rules and regulations pertaining to such opening or breaking and connection to such lines as he may deem necessary to protect the City sewers and provide for a proper connection."

Section 3. That the Revised Code of Payette, 1946, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Section 9-814 (a), which reads as follows:

"9-814 (a). Garages, Service Stations, Wash racks, Etc. Wherever deemed necessary by an Inspector of the State Plumbing Board of Idaho, all garages, service stations, wash racks, etc., shall be equipped with sand and grease interceptors as required by and constructed to standards prescribed by the State Plumbing Board of Idaho. Interceptors now installed which do not conform to such

standards at this time shall be rebuilt to such standards, or alternates approved by an Inspector of the State Plumbing Board of Idaho, within thirty (30) days after the passage, approval and publication of this Ordinance."
