

ORDINANCE NO. 105 BY W. H. PLATT.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT IRRIGATION DITCHES, CROSSING ANY AND ALL STREETS OR ALLEYS, WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PAYETTE, SHALL BE CONDUCTED UNDER SAID STREETS OR ALLEYS BY MEANS OF AN UNDERGROUND WATERWAY, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette:

Section 1. That all persons or corporations owning irrigating ditches that cross any of the streets or alleys of the City of Payette or taking water through any such ditch, shall be required to convey the said water across the streets and alleys by means of underground waterways or siphons. Said waterways or siphons shall be constructed in a substantial and workmanlike manner, and not allowed to leak and flood the streets and alleys, or cause muddy places therein, and shall be placed a sufficient depth underground to allow the streets and alleys to be leveled to the established grade.

Section 2. That all persons who fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, within 30 days after its passage and publication, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and costs; and in addition to said fine it shall be the duty of the City of Payette to put in said waterway or siphon, at the expense of the person or persons who are liable therefor, and to collect the same by suit in any court having jurisdiction thereof.
