

ORDINANCE No 207

By WOODWARD and BURNS

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING A SYSTEM OF HOUSE NUMBERING FOR THE CITY OF PAYETTE AND FIXING THE CHARACTER AND LOCATION OF SAID NUMBERS.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Idaho.

Sec.1. DECIMAL SYSTEM ADOPTED.

The decimal system of numbering houses and buildings is hereby adopted.

Sec.2. NUMBERING BUILDINGS ON AVENUES.

To all that portion of avenues lying between the west boundary line of the City of Payette and Second Street, two hundred (200) numbers shall be assigned.

Beginning at Second St., calling it 200, and running in an easterly direction, one hundred (100) numbers shall be assigned to each block.

On all avenues, all even numbers shall be placed on the ~~North~~ <sup>South</sup> side of said avenues, and the odd numbers alternating shall be placed on the ~~South~~ <sup>North</sup> side of said avenues.

Sec.3. NUMBERING BUILDINGS ON STREETS.

Beginning at Sixth Avenue ~~North~~ <sup>South</sup>, calling it four hundred (400) and running in a northerly direction, one hundred (100) numbers shall be assigned to each block.

On all streets, all even numbers shall be placed on the east side of said streets, and the odd numbers alternating shall be placed on the west side of said streets.

Sec.4. ONE NUMBER TO EACH FIFTEEN FEET.

While one hundred numbers are allotted to each block, the division of numbers to the frontage thereof shall be one number to each fifteen feet, or such other even part of a lot or block frontage as shall, in the judgement of the city engineer, be deemed most advisable, it being intended hereby to preserve as nearly as possible a general uniformity in numbering throughout the city.

Blocks approximately double the ordinary frontage shall contain two hundred (200) numbers, and in all undivided tracts of land intervening between land laid out in blocks, the lines of streets shall be considered as crossing in regular continuation of streets in adjoining additions.

For convenience of numbering in unplatted sections of the city, each three hundred seventy five (375) feet shall be termed a block.

Sec.5. MISTAKES OR CONFLICT IN NUMBERING.

In all cases of mistake or conflict in numbering, or where some especial arrangement is necessary in consequence of irregularity of streets or avenues, or want of uniformity in the size of blocks, the city engineer shall direct and make the proper adjustment in accordance with the spirit and intention of this ordinance.

Sec.6. ENGINEER MUST FURNISH OFFICIAL NUMBER.

The city engineer shall assign to each house its proper number, and upon application shall deliver, free of charge, to the owner or occupant thereof, a certificate designating the number.

Sec.7. OWNER, OCCUPANT or AGENT MUST NUMBER HOUSE OR BUILDING.

It is hereby made the duty of every owner, occupant or agent of all buildings, upon all the streets and avenues of the City of Payette, Idaho upon which a system of numbering has been adopted, <sup>to number</sup> their said buildings in accordance with the provisions of <sup>this ordinance</sup> within ninety days from the passage, approval and publication of said ordinance.

Sec.8. SIZE, CHARACTER and PLACE OF NUMBERS.

All numbers shall be of aluminum, white metal or nickel plated metal, or may consist of gilt lettering on the inside of a glass transom or door; all numbers shall be distinctly legible and at least three (3) inches in length; and all such metallic figures shall be posted conspicuously over or upon the front door of the building to which the same are to be attached.

Sec. 9. PENALTY.

Every owner, occupant or agent of any building now erected or hereafter to be erected in the City of Fayette, Idaho who shall omit, neglect or fail to comply with any of the requirements of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction, be fined in a sum not less than two dollars nor more than ten dollars for each offense; and each days continuance of the act forbidden, or omission of the duty required, shall be deemed a separate offense, and fined and punished accordingly.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval and publication in the official ~~newspaper~~ newspaper.
