

ORDINANCE NO. 289

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF TRAFFIC IN THE STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF PAYETTE, IDAHO; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 285 AND ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette;

Section 1.

The word "vehicle" as used in this ordinance includes every description of carriage or other artificial contrivance used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on land, except baby carriages.

The word "driver" as used in this ordinance includes one employed in conducting a coach, carriage, wagon, or other vehicle with horses, mules or other animals; also one who controls the movements of any motor vehicle or the like; also the rider of any bicycle.

Section 2.

It shall be unlawful for any driver to operate any vehicle within the corporate limits of the City of Payette at a greater speed than ~~thirty~~ <sup>twenty</sup> miles an hour.

Section 3.

It shall be unlawful for any driver to operate any motor vehicle upon any street or avenue within the corporate limits of the City of Payette unless said motor vehicle be provided with adequate brakes in good working order and also provided with adequate horns or other suitable devices for signaling.

Section 4.

It shall be unlawful for any driver to operate upon any street, avenue, alley or other public place within the corporate limits of the City of Payette between the hours of thirty minutes after sun down and thirty minutes before sun rise, any motor vehicle, except a motor cycle, without having thereon two front lamps properly lighted and burning and one rear lamp properly lighted and burning and displaying a red light; all of said lights must be lighted and burning while said motor vehicle is in motion, and all muffler cut-outs must be kept closed.

Section 5.

It shall be unlawful for any driver to operate upon any street, avenue, alley or other public place within the corporate limits of the City of Payette between the hours of thirty minutes after sun down and thirty minutes before sun rise, any motor cycle without having thereon one front ~~light~~ lamp properly lighted and burning and one rear lamp properly lighted and burning and displaying a red light; all of said lights must be lighted and burning while said motor cycle is in motion, and all muffler cut-outs must be kept closed.

Section 6.

Any vehicle meeting another upon any street, avenue, alley or other public place within the corporate limits of the City of Payette shall pass to the right and any vehicle overtaking another upon any street, avenue, alley or other public place within the corporate limits of the City of Payette shall pass to the left of the vehicle overtaken, and shall not pull over to the right until entirely clear of the vehicle so overtaken. All vehicles must travel on the right side of the street or avenue upon which said vehicle is traveling, except when passing a vehicle overtaken.

Section 7.

The driver of any vehicle within the corporate limits of the City of Payette who desires or intends to turn into an intersecting street to the left, must keep to the right of the center of such intersecting street.

Section 7A.

The driver of any motor vehicle ~~within the corporate limits~~ upon any street or avenue within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, Idaho, intending to turn to the left at any place upon such street or avenue, or at ~~the intersection of any intersection~~ any intersection thereof, shall signal his ~~and~~ intention by holding out his left hand so as to ~~make~~ properly warn all persons of his intention before making such turn.

Section 7B.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 16 years to drive any motor vehicle within the corporate limits of the City of Payette, Idaho.

~~any person or persons violating any or the provisions~~ of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not less than Five or more than One Hundred Dollars, or imprisoned in the jail of the City of Payette for ~~not~~ <sup>at least</sup> not less than three days nor more than ~~sixty~~ <sup>thirty</sup> days, or by both fine and imprisonment.

Section 9.

Ordinance No. 285 and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 10.

This ordinance shall be in full force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official newspaper.
