

ORDINANCE NO. 60.

Annual appropriation Ordinance.

Be it enacted by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette, Canyon County, Idaho:

That there is hereby levied upon all the taxable property within the City of Payette, for the fiscal year, the following sums, to-wit:

Section I. To the General Expense Fund the sum of Three (3) mills on the One (1.) Dollar of assessed valuation.

Section II. To the Road Fund the sum of Two (2) mills on the One (1) Dollar of assessed valuation.

Section III. To the Salary Fund the sum of One (1) mill on the One (1) Dollar of assessed valuation.

ORDINANCE NO. 60.

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Payette.

Section 1. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday of May, 1905, against all the taxable property within the limits of the City of Payette, the sum of 1 mill on each One Dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy together with all licenses and fines, shall be placed in the General fund of the said City of Payette.

Section 2. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday of May, 1905, against all the taxable property within the limits of the City of Payette, the sum of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  mills on each One Dollar for the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy shall be placed in the Salary fund of the said City of Payette.

Section 3. That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year commencing on the first Tuesday of May, 1905, against all taxable property within the City of Payette, the sum of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  mills on each One Dollar of the assessed valuation of such property, and the funds realized from such levy shall be placed in the Road fund of the said City of Payette.
